Dear Friends

The "Second Temple" was built to replace Solomon's Temple, destroyed by the Babylonians in the 6th century BC and partially rebuilt and it was enhanced hugely by Herod the Great. It was a massive structure, designed to impress, and a sort of "vanity project" for Herod. 36 acres in total, its highest point was approx 150 ft and gold plates adorned the frontage, to dazzle the hundreds of thousands of pilgrims who made their way three times a year for the great feasts. White marble gave the visitors the impression from afar that snow had landed on its magnificent tops.

Against this religious "Mar-A-Lago", the epicentre of Jewish life, Jesus predicted that:

" the days will come when there will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down."

This must have sounded like the delusional ravings of a madman, but within a generation that prophecy was fulfilled when the Roman forces laid siege to Jerusalem, massacred 600,000+ according to Tacitus, and set fire to the Temple. The gold and silver adorning the building melted into the massive stones so the Romans dismantled the whole edifice. To this day only the Western("Wailing") wall is left standing.

Again and again, Jesus tries to make his disciples understand that nothing in this passing life is permanent, even the things and people we love, whom God has given us for comfort and consolation. Only One is eternal, only One is forever, our Heavenly Father. As St John writes:

May we cherish these words of comfort in the face of sadness and suffering, and may they be a consolation and a hope. In this grey month of November, may they bring light for our paths and joy for our hearts.

Praise to you, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

the source of all consolation and hope.

Be the refuge of all who suffer from abuse and violence.

Comfort them and send healing for their wounds of the body, soul and spirit.

Help us all and make us one with you in your love for justice,

as we deepen our respect for the dignity of every human life.

Giver of peace, make us one in celebrating your praise, both now and forever.



Join us in Prayer and Fasting:

Fasting

Fast from all food except bread and water for the day

Or

Fast from a particular food or luxury, e.g. chocolate, alcohol, cigarettes, TV.

Fast from whatever you can given your state of health etc, but make sure it is something that involves a sacrifice to yourself.

Prayer

We are asking people to say a Rosary (or an extra Rosary if you say it daily already).

You could also offer an extra effort such as going to Mass (or an extra Mass) on the day, or going to Adoration. You can even pray before a closed tabernacle if Adoration is not available near you.

And He said to them; This kind (of demon) can go out by nothing, but by prayer and fasting. (Gospel of Mark 9:29)
