Dear Friends

Laws are made " to regulate human relationships", as one definition puts it. Countries may share some common laws like a prohibition on murder, but in other areas there may be a divergence. For example, women in some Muslim countries are not allowed the same freedom as in the West.

The people of Israel had a set of 613 commandments to follow, the most fundamental of which were the Ten Commandments , also known as The Decalogue. The book of Exodus relates how Moses, the Law- giver, descended from Mount Sinai with these Commandments inscribed on two tablets of stone...to discover the people partying and worshipping a golden Calf, the image of an Egyptian god.

Time and again, as the Fourth Eucharistic prayer tells us, the Lord God sent prophets to bring the people back to His laws and time and again they fell back into disobedience and sin. We could say that the Old Testament is a story of failure. God is faithful but His people are fickle and faithless.

In the New Testament a New Covenant is made, this time not in the blood of lambs or goats or bulls, but in the Body and Blood of the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world. On Calvary Cross, the Son of God is offered as that final sacrifice which atones for our constant failings and sinfulness, and brings us hope that fallen as we are, the Lord has made that reconciliation on our behalf, the price paid, the debt redeemed. I often think that if we took time to ponder on this mystery, we would all be more joyful in our daily lives!
