Dear Friends

Last weekend I read out the Decree from our Archbishop announcing the "extinctive union" between St Teresa's, Charlbury and Holy Trinity, Chipping Norton. For those who missed it, the decree is now on both church websites, and also posted at the back of each. It has also been conveyed electronically to those who receive the newsletter weekly.

Fundamentally, the two former parishes of Holy Trinity and St Teresa's are merging into one new parish, called "The Assumption" with Holy Trinity as the parish church. Both churches will keep their dedications as Holy Trinity and St Teresa's.

In terms of weekday and weekend Masses, nothing will change. When the Archbishop asked me to take on the two parishes, instead of St Teresa's only, the Mass pattern was altered to the one we now operate and which has proved to be successful. The major issue in Charlbury is parking with so many of the congregation travelling into town from the outlying villages, not an unusual country practice! Chipping Norton does not suffer from either of those aspects as many live in the town itself and there is adequate parking with the use of the adjacent school car park on a Saturday/ Sunday.

In recent years, numbers have grown in both churches, as the COVID "slump" works itself out. It is particularly pleasing to record a healthy stream of First Communions and adult Confirmations. Long may this continue! I must record my great thanks to Mary Prior and Nareen Bowers for taking on the Catechist roles so proficiently and easily. Both churches boast small armies of volunteers some prominent but many working quietly behind the scenes to ensure all runs as it should. Recently, Sharnalee Foster has
